Advanced bowel (colorectal) cancer means cancer that has spread outside your bowel to other parts of your body. Treatment includes chemotherapy, surgery, targeted cancer drugs (biological therapies) and radiotherapy.

Colorectal cancer is locally invasive but metastatic spread may be evident before local growth produces symptoms. The most common site for metastatic spread is the liver. Other sites (eg, the lungs, brain and bone) are unusual in the absence of liver metastases.

The exact cause of colorectal cancer (colon or rectal cancer) is unknown. But, things called risk factors can increase the chance of a person developing it. Having one or more risk factors does not mean you will definitely get colon cancer. And if you do not have any risk factors, it does not mean you will not get colon cancer.

The symptoms of bowel (colorectal) cancer in men and women can include: bleeding from the back passage (rectum) or blood in your poo a change in your normal bowel habit, such as looser poo, pooing more often or constipation a lump that your doctor can feel in your back passage or tummy (abdomen), more commonly on the right side

In some cases, bowel cancer can stop digestive waste passing through the bowel. This is known as a bowel obstruction. Symptoms of a bowel obstruction can include: intermittent, and occasionally severe, abdominal pain – this is always bought on by eating

Surgery is the main form of treatment for bowel (colorectal) cancer. The part of the bowel containing the cancer is removed and the two ends of the bowel are then joined together. If it is not possible to rejoin the two ends then a colostomy or ileostomy may be required. (For more on this see ' Stoma '.)

The symptoms of bowel cancer may include: blood in or on your poo (stools), or bleeding from the back passage (rectum) – the blood may be bright red or dark a change in your normal bowel habit that happens for no obvious reason and lasts longer than three weeks – for example, diarrhoea or constipation

Colorectal cancer accounts for approximately 10% of all annually diagnosed cancers and cancer-related deaths worldwide. 1 It is the second most common cancer diagnosed in women and third most in men. In women, incidence and mortality are approximately 25% lower than in men.
